In Advent we prepare our hearts, minds and spirits for the birth of Jesus and open ourselves to God living anew within us and among us.

Your presence in worship is one way to prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Each Sunday we will light a different Advent Candle representing Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. Each Sunday we will hear a scripture that offers insight and a way to reflect on God's saving love in ancient days that is still present in these times. 





FCC Has a New Wheelchair!!



First Christian Church has a new indoor-use wheelchair! After being wheelchair-less for several months, the church now has a brand new wheelchair for members and guests to use as needed. Because the chair has narrow tires it is intended for indoor use only, to get around inside the church building.

For the time being the wheelchair will be stored in the conference room on the first floor. Users of the wheelchair are asked to return it to the conference room so that others who need a wheelchair can readily find it.

The wheelchair is very easy to use, and an instruction pamphlet is in the pocket on the back of the chair.

Anyone who uses the wheelchair must remember to set the wheel brakes before letting anyone sit on or get up from the chair. Setting the brakes before sitting down and standing up makes the wheelchair much safer.

Also, anyone who uses the wheelchair should note that releases on each footrest allow the footrests to swing out of the way for easier access to the wheelchair.

Disciples Coffee Project



Equal Exchange started with an idea: what if food could be traded in a way that is honest and fair, a way that empowers both farmers and consumers? Three decades later, Equal Exchange continues to work toward building a different kind of food system. We are invited to play a part in these efforts through the Disciples of Christ Fair Trade Project! Started in 2008, the project is a collaboration between Equal Exchange, Disciples Home Missions and Week of Compassion to involve more Disciples in supporting small farmers around the world.



Equal Exchange helps small farmers earn a sustainable income through fairly traded coffee, teas, chocolate and other food products. For each pound of fairly traded items Disciples purchase through the Fair Trade Project, 15 cents per pound goes to the Project's Small Farmer Fund. According to the Equal Exchange website, that fund amounted to \$1168.82 in 2017 alone!




