

Prayer Vigil Sign-Up

For many decades, FCC has offered a Prayer Vigil as a time of prayer, quietness and peace on the journey from Good Friday to Easter. In vigil, we stand watch from the darkness of the crucifixion of Jesus on Friday to the joyous shout of "Alleluia, Christ is risen!" at the empty tomb on Easter morning. This year's Prayer Vigil will begin at 1 pm on Friday, April 19th and continue until 6 am on Easter Sunday, April 21st.

The FCC Coffeehouse will be set up with two "prayer stations". The space will be transformed in a way that promotes prayer, reflection and anticipation of Easter. Bibles, prayer guides and books, a prayer path, art supplies, writing materials, a prayer board, children's materials and more will be on hand to encourage your prayer and meditation in whatever way you find most helpful. However, you may also choose to pray from home.

For signing up, half-hour slots are available, and multiple time-slots may be selected. Signups may be made <u>online</u> or there will be a signup board at the back of the FCC Sanctuary, by the Welcome table. Please indicate your choice of FCC or home when you sign up. Someone will be stationed at FCC's entry door both nights for those who choose to pray at FCC during those times after dark.

The Easter offering, received on April 14 and 21, will be a bit different this year. We will be utilizing this special offering as a vehicle for giving to the general manifestation of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). As our approved budget did not include any contributions to the general or regional church (only local outreach ministries), the Trustees recommended and the church Board approved that the unexpected profit from 2018 be given directly to the general church.

This means that \$7,500 will be given from the FCC profit in our Easter offering. Last year members of our congregation gave \$901 in this special offering. Wouldn't it be wonderful to make this year's offering 10 times that amount or \$9,010?

The Easter offering supports the general ministries of the larger church including Disciples Home Missions; the National Benevolent Association and other critical services to local congregations like ours. Please prayerfully consider a generous gift to this year's Easter offering.

News from the FCC Library

As the new Church Librarian, I wanted to provide an update to members of the congregation, both to share my thoughts about future directions for the library, and to let you know of a few projects that are currently underway.

First of all, FCC is fortunate to have an excellent library that has been well cared-for through the years. This fact alone made me happy to assume this new responsibility. We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the Gaunt family, in particular, who have been the most recent stewards of the collection. Thanks to their hard work, we have a good assortment of books, including many newer titles, most of which are cataloged, classified with Dewey Decimal numbers, and searchable via the library computer.

Building on this solid foundation, here are my top five priorities for the library:

- Inventory the current collection and get it back in a usable working order through the re-labeling of books and shelves. (Most of the existing book labels have grown faded and unreadable, and the shelf arrangement could be more user-friendly.)
- 2. Restore access to the online catalog (via the library computer) and explore ways to make

the catalog available from remote locations as well.

- 3. Catch-up on purchasing new items for the collection, concentrating on books that have been published in the last few years.
- 4. Plan for more regular promotion of library resources, especially new items.
- 5. Review the relationship between the library and church archives/local history collections.

I have already begun the inventory and relabeling project, which is likely to require 3-4 weeks, and will be somewhat disruptive. If you glance in the library, you'll notice that a growing number of books have work-slips tucked into them, and may be stacked or tipped on their sides. If you would like help finding or borrowing a book during the next few weeks, please contact me directly and I will be most happy to assist! (See contact information below.) There's no reason the library can't be used during this time period—the books will still be in (relatively) good order by Dewey Decimal number, but I suspect I'll be able to locate an item more quickly than you can.

If you have questions about this current project, or comments/suggestions about the library in general, let me hear from you! I look forward to working with you in this capacity.






