

oin us in Ames for a weekend of activities exploring what it means to be the church, foolishly present with neighbors we've been taught to overlook. Author and pastor Lee Roorda Schott will build on her book, Foolish Church: Messy, Raw, Real, and Making Room to share what we churches outside can learn from the church she has led for eight years, Women at the Well, inside the Iowa women's prison in Mitchellville. We'll consider welcome, authenticity, boundaries, relationship, accountability, and reconciliation. We'll be joined by Women at the Well volunteers and staff, including its minister of reentry and congregational care, Rev. Our worship will be enriched with the presence of musician and psalmist Richard Bruxvoort Colligan, of Strawberry Point, who creates adventurous music for the ever-evolving church.






Authors in our Library


This month's profiled authors include a Catholic nun, a Buddhist monk, and a minister in our own Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Check out their books!



<u>Joan Chittister</u> is an American Benedictine nun, theologian, author and speaker. She has served as president of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious, and currently co-chairs the Global Peace Initiative of Women—a partner organization of the United Nations, facilitating a worldwide network of women peace builders. She is the author or more than 50 books dealing primarily with monasticism, justice and equality (especially for women in church and society), interfaith topics, and world peace. We have two of Sister Joan's books in the FCC Library: *Faith & Ferment: An Interdisciplinary Study of Christian Beliefs and Practices* (1983; coauthored with Martin E. Marty); and *The Gift of Years: Growing Older Gracefully* (2008).

Thich Nhat Hanh is a Buddhist monk, Zen Master, poet, scholar, and peace activist. Born in Vietnam in 1926, he was nominated by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. for the Nobel Peace Prize in 1967 and led the Vietnamese Buddhist Peace Delegation to the Paris Peace Talks in 1969. A prolific writer, Nhat Hanh has published over 100 titles in English, ranging from classic manuals on meditation, mindfulness and Engaged Buddhism, to poems, children's stories, and commentaries on ancient Buddhist texts. We currently have six of his books in the library: Going Home: Jesus and Buddha as Brothers (1999); Living Buddha, Living Christ (10th Anniversary ed., 2007); Silence: The Power of Quiet in a World Full of Noise (2015); The Way Out Is In: The Zen Calligraphy of Thich Nhat Hanh (2015); At Home in the World: Stories and Essential Teachings from a Monk's Life (2016); and The Art of Living: Peace and Freedom in the Here and Now (2017).





<u>Sandhya Rani Jha</u> is a minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and serves as an anti-racism/anti-oppression trainer with the denomination's Reconciliation Ministries. She is also the founder and director of the Oakland Peace Center, a collective of 40 organizations creating access, equity and dignity for all in the Oakland (California) Area. Her podcast, *Hope from the Hood*, is available on iTunes and at sandhyajha.com. The FCC Library holds two of the author's books: *Room at the Table: Struggle for Unity and Equality in Disciples History* (2009); and *Transforming Communities: How People Like You are Healing Their Neighborhoods* (2017).



After over 50 years of use, the flat roof over the Dining Hall has finally given us all the years it has to give. We now have a perpetual leak over the kitchen that can no longer be repaired. Consequently, the entire roof over the Dining Hall needs to be replaced as soon as possible. This work must take place quickly in order for the Lodge to be sealed up for the winter.

Regional staff have explored many options including filing an insurance claim as well as changing the pitch of the roof for future longevity. Incredibly, the company with the lowest bid is also the one that can meet our pressing need. Roof work begins this week!




