### Reconciliation Ministry offering Sept. 27, Oct. 4

### The Rocks Are Crying Out: Show Up, Speak Up, Stand Up.

Some Pharisees from the crowd told him, "Teacher, get your disciples under control!" But he said, "If they kept quiet, the stones would do it for them, shouting praise."

Luke 19:39-40 MSG version

t has been 20 years since we proclaimed our anti-racist and proreconciliation identity. We keep trying it on to see if it fits. Over and over again, we find that it does. On September 27<sup>th</sup> and October 4<sup>th</sup>, we will receive the special offering for Reconciliation Ministry congregations.

This year's theme is fitting for our response to the sustained unrest that has propelled the many to engage in social activism in small towns and major cities. The Rocks Are Crying Out: Show Up, Speak Up, Stand Up, based in Luke 19:36 -40, reminds us, that like those first century disciples following Jesus into Jerusalem, we must lift our voices to acknowledge the divine message and the divine messenger that is Christ with us. We are the ones to break the silence of oppression and suppression of human dignity based on the color of a person's skin or their nation of origin.

The harmful impact of systemic racism has been lain bare in the health disparities of those impacted by the novel coronavirus, compelling us to 'speak up' naming the conditions that unjustly impact poor, black, and brown communities.

The extra-judicial treatment of black and brown bodies has compelled many to 'show up' in peaceful protests to affirm equitable treatment by law enforcement and to affirm human dignity for ALL.

We, too, are compelled to 'stand up' to witness to Christ's profound love on behalf of those who are without hope



This summer a group of 20-25 FCC folks gathered weekly to study the book, White Fragility by Robin Di Angelo. Beginning Wednesday, October 7<sup>th</sup> 6:45-8:00 pm there will be a

new weekly study for all interested in seeking to understand racism. This time we will be reading the book, *How To Be An Anti-Racist* by Ibram X. Kendi.

Dr. Kendi is one of America's foremost historians and leading antiracist voices. He is the Founding Director of the Boston University Center for Antiracist Research and contributor writer at The Atlantic. He will become the 2020-2021 Frances B. Cashin Fellow at the Radcliffe Institute for the Advanced Study at Harvard University.

Books are available from your favorite book outlet. Also, our own FCC library has 2 copies to loan (Call the church office to find a time to pick it up, or FCC Librarian David Gregory to make other arrangements). Let Pastor Mary Jane know if you have any trouble getting a book.

# An Update from the FCC Trustees

ince the pandemic disrupted our weekly, in-person gatherings, income continues to decline compared to previous years. Last month, we reported a year-to-date (YTD) income/expense deficit of roughly \$13,000, and this deficit has now grown to over \$23,000 (as of September 1). With 66% of the calendar year elapsed, we have received about 42% of our pledges. We are hopeful that, with your continued help, we will close this gap as the year proceeds. In the meantime, we have sufficient reserves in our general fund to ensure that we can pay our bills and meet our financial obligations.

Typically, in the month of September, a letter is mailed from the church office to all those who have pledged for the current year, providing donors with a record of what they have given to date (through August 30). In the hope that this information is helpful, we will continue the practice this year; please watch for this update letter. We understand that people have been impacted in very different ways by the pandemic. If you are unable to meet your full pledge, we understand and are deeply grateful for what you can give. If you are able to give beyond your original pledge, we greatly appreciate that as well.

As always, thank you for your generosity, and for helping to ensure that the church can continue its ministries and meet its financial obligations during these challenging times.


One important way we can stay connected during this time of social distancing and shelter-inplace is to continue to pray with and for one another, our community, and the world.



# **CROP HUNGER WALK**



# FCC has a CROP Walk Team!

he COVID pandemic has changed the way we do so many things this year, and the annual CROP Hunger Walk is no exception. Our community will still celebrate "CROP Walk Sunday" on October 11, but there will be no community walk. Instead, "virtual teams" will concentrate on fund-raising, which has always been the ultimate goal of the CROP Hunger Walk. As in years past, First Christian Church has assembled a team to participate in this worthwhile effort.

Members of the FCC CROP Walk Team for 2020 include Pastor Mary Jane Button-Harrison, Cynthia Gaunt, Eileen Sambos, Vern Hawkins, Stacey Maifeld, Scott and Tiffany Walker, Anleah Walker, and Mary and David Gregory (co-chairs). "Virtual Walkers" will plan and report on their own individual walks, which they'll do sometime before October 11, in the spirit of the traditional community walk. CROP Walking has always been a symbolic gesture, to honor people around the world who *must* walk—every day, and often for great distances—to secure food and water.




