

#### Message from the Trustees

he Church has diligently weathered the past few years as we continue to emerge from the Pandemic. We are providing vibrant worship experiences centered around our four key ministries: Worshipping God, Building Faith, Growing Connections, and Loving Neighbors. The financial support of Church members and friends continues to assist in helping meet our Mission and financial responsibilities, and for that we are grateful.

Our current budget numbers do warrant our concern. In 2022, we continue to operate with a year-to-date deficit—that is, the cumulative difference between **income** and **expenses**. # Christian Church Foundation Market Commentary Sept. 20, 2022

Market volatility has returned with a vengeance. After a brief rally during the first part of summer, significant volatility has returned to the financial markets once more.

Last week's consumer price index report was hotter than expected—core inflation climbed 0.6% in August on a month-over-month basis. The stronger than anticipated inflation number led to a steep sell-off in both stocks and bonds. The fear is an even more aggressive Fed will raise interest rates ever higher and drive the U.S. economy into a recession.

The markets are in a tug-of-war between inflation concerns and recession woes. During this period of great uncertainty, volatility is inevitable. From mid-June to mid-August, we saw the good side of volatility. And over the last months, we have seen the bad side of volatility.

Market volatility is unsettling, but historically not unusual. Since 1950 there have been 12 markets declines of 20% or more. The average decline was 33% and the average duration was 12 months. Sell-offs always come to an end and it's important to note that once stocks bottomed, they rallied sharply over shorter time periods. On average, the S&P 500 returned 13% in the month following the bottom, 35% in the six months following the bottom, and 65% in the 12 months following the bottom. In other words, market rebounds tend to be frontloaded, which is why market timing simply does not work. Time in the market is what matters.

When markets are rough, the best ballast is the combination of a diversified portfolio and a prudent investment discipline. At the Foundation, we remain focused on growing your dollars for ministry today and tomorrow.

Seminars on How Community Land Trusts (CLTs)
Create Permanent Affordable Housing

This is something exciting for AMOS church members/institutions. On these days, AMOS and the city of Des Moines will bring Grounded Solutions, the experts in Community Land Trusts (CLT's), to Des Moines for a series of meetings to inform attendees of the benefits of CLTs.

CLT'S are a way to create affordable housing that stays affordable forever and looks like other properties in the neighborhood so it's welcomed by the neighbors!

How is this possible? With the purchase of a CLT home, the buyer purchases only the structure on the property and a trust holds the land. If the owner later wishes to sell, the owner agrees to accept only a portion of the increase in value in order to preserve affordability for the next buyer. The owner may also choose to pass the property along to his or her heirs.

While this is a new idea for the Des Moines Metro, it is in use in 225 other communities in the U.S. and is now an integral part of how other communities are dealing with skyrocketing real estate prices. CLTs have a proven track record of

- offering affordability in perpetuity
- providing for successive lower-income buyers with every property
- preserving the diversity and quality of life in our city
- slowing gentrification
- saving tax dollars for the city and county

Whether you are hearing about CLT's for the first time and want to learn more or are a seasoned advocate for affordable housing, plan to attend one or more of these informative trainings on November 16 and 17. There will be more details soon, but you'll want to get this on your calendar. Feel free to email me should you have questions!

**Challenge:** City of Ames home owners schedule a <u>free</u> energy audit. Story County residents who have Alliant Energy, do their <u>free</u> online home assessment. Let us know what you learned.

The Green Team had their Earth Care Fair on Sunday, September 11, following worship. We had information about the Ames and Iowa State glass recycling programs, eco-friendly cleaning products, Ames stormwater control rebate programs and the City of Ames Composting Program. The city donated a compost pail that we had a drawing for. The information will be posted for you to review again. Please note the announcement in the Call about the City of Ames EcoFair on Saturday, October 1, 2022. Hope you can go.

We have received the report of the free energy audit done on our building. The report was very good. The one main recommendation was to replace the old window air conditioners with newer more efficient air conditioners. Here is a quick overview of the audit:

- Heating System no change, continue tune-ups.
- Water Heating no change recommended.
- Cooling System Replacement of window units would save money.
- Lighting no change recommended (already use LEDs).
- Insulation and windows attic insulation is good, for future remodeling recommend wall insulation, and windows are fine.
- Appliances (Plug Load) no immediate replacement of appliances recommended.

A big thank you goes to Jim Lester and the Property Committee for their upkeep on our building and for scheduling our free energy audit!

#### **Climate Change Corner**

On December 21st, 2021 the Ames City Council voted to reduce emissions by 83% by 2030 over 2018 levels and to reach net-zero by 2050. The City has created a Climate Action Plan, What is a Climate Action Plan? The Climate Action

Plan (CAP) is a framework and action plan that outlines the guiding principles and resulting action plan needed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Ames. A climate action plan (CAP) is a tool that helps communities understand their influence on greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs), and then plan to reduce GHGs in a way that supports community wellbeing and economic growth. One of the areas of the CAP is Smart Energy. The city leaders and employees can only do so much. The citizens of Ames need to do their part. The city has created rebate programs (see https:// www.cityofames.org/government/departmentsdivisions-a-h/electric/smart-energy/residentialprograms for more information on energy rebates). Smart Energy rebates are designed to help Ames Electric Services customers conserve energy and reduce their environmental impact. As advances are made in energy-saving technologies, the rebates are updated as well. The city has built these programs around asking customers to strive for the next level of energy savings. Keep saving energy and lowering your carbon footprint! The city is also offering a free residential energy audit (https://www.cityofames.org/ government/departments-divisions-a-h/electric/smart -energy/residential-energy-audit-request-form).

For our FCC members that don't live in Ames, Alliant Energy has a free online home energy assessment (https://www.alliantenergy.com/alliantenergynews/illuminate/26-homeenergyassessment) and rebates (https://www.alliantenergy.com/waystosave/rebatesandmarketplace/iageneralrebates). If you have another energy provider, check their website for energy audits and rebates.


